Ransburg Scout Reservation

With 624 acres surrounded by the Hoosier National Forest and Lake Monroe, Ransburg Scout Reservation is one of the Midwest's premier camps. A 15-minute drive from Bloomington, IN, the camp offers a wide range of opportunities in a beautiful, hilly, hardwood forest setting in one of the most beautiful areas of Indiana.

It has two newly built lake-front condominium-style buildings, which house a total of 36 each, and a beautiful lake-front retreat lodge, which can house 20. The dining hall seats 550 and is available from September to May. It also has one of the Midwest's best rope courses and climbing towers, which is ideal for teambuilding activities. Parking and primitive camping are available for up to 1,000 people.

Facilities



- Aquatics Retreat Center, for youth activities and company retreats
- 40-foot climbing tower
- Rope courses, low and high
- Climbing Tower, must have certified instructor
- Teambuilding area, must have certified instructor (C.O.P.E.)
- Professionally developed orienteering course
- Campfire area for 700 people
- 7 shelters for day activities
- Cabin sleeping for groups of 100
- 2 condominium-style buildings with 3 apartments each. Apartments have common area, kitchen, showers and bedrooms (2 sleep 8, and 1 sleeps 20).
- 22 camping areas (19 in main camping area and 3 others at Adventure Point and Wilderness Point)
- Bunk house, sleeps 12
- 2 shower houses (water April 15-Oct. 15)
- Health Lodge
- Lounge, seats 15
- Chapel area
- Hiking trails
- Dining hall, seats 550



Inlow Center

- Kitchen area with stove and refrigerator
- 3 bedrooms, sleeps 32 total
- Large meeting room, seats 100
- Small meeting room, seats 20
- Loft, seats 50
- Showers and restrooms
